ENTRY RULES & REGULATIONS

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY.

ENTRIES

1. Entries in all classes **MUST** be made on the form provided. All exhibitors entering in Section A to Section R will be charged a \$10 entry fee which will entitle exhibitors to a 3-day pass to the Carman Country Fair. Entry fees will be collected at the time the entry is made; if the entry is mailed, faxed or emailed, fees will be collected when articles are brought to the Fair Grounds.
2. Entry fee in each class of all sections SA to X (Junior and School) shall be 10 (ten) percent of the total prize money paid out to the exhibitor.
3. To register, entry forms may be:
 - brought in person to the Fair Office,
 - FAXed to 745-6514
 - phoned in during office hours to 745-2226
 - emailed to carmfair@mts.net.
 - mailed to Box 937, Carman, MB ROG OJ0

Deadline for registering is Monday, July 6 at 9 p.m. Late entries will NOT be accepted. When faxing or emailing entries, exhibitors are responsible for phoning to ensure fax was transmitted and emails are received by the date indicated.

EXHIBITS

1. Exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor and completed within the past two years.
2. Exhibits must not have previously taken a prize at any Dufferin Agricultural Exhibition.
3. Only one entry will be allowed per exhibitor in each class.
4. Exhibitors are responsible for securely fastening entry tags to exhibits.
5. Articles may be sent postage paid to the office. All other exhibits must be brought to the Fair Grounds on Tues., July 7, between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. or Wed., July 8 between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. **Articles not received by 10 a.m. Wednesday July 8, will not be entered for judging.**
6. Exhibitors responsible for entering their exhibit in the proper class.
7. Class cancellations or amendments to the exhibit book will be published in the Valley Leader latest June issue.
8. The Directors will take every precaution under the circumstances to ensure the safety of exhibits sent to the exhibition, and should property be accidentally damaged, lost or stolen, they will give all the assistance in their power toward recovery of same, but will not accept financial responsibility.
9. A meeting of the Directors will be held, notice of which will be given, to hear and decide any complaints or grievances that may have arisen in awarding of prizes. Protests must be made in writing to the Secretary-Manager within 7 days after the close of the exhibition.
10. Any infringement of the Rules and Regulations will result in withholding the prizes.

JUDGING & PRIZES

1. Scoring of points in all classes and sections are as follows:
1st prize-3 points; 2nd prize-2 points; 3rd prize-1 point.
2. Prize money to be allocated in each class of the entire book is as follows:
1st prize-\$5. 2nd prize-\$3. 3rd prize-\$2.
3. School exhibits will be closed off at 6:30 p.m; other exhibits close at 7:30 p.m. on Sat, July 11.

Articles must be removed from Exhibit Bldg by 10 p.m.

Anyone picking up someone else's articles will be required to sign a requisition form. The Society will not be responsible for articles left after the last day of the fair.

ARTS

-Framed pictures must have hangers.

-When article is to be mounted, it should be attached to a background of poster paper, bristol board, etc.

-When mounting or framing is called for, only the method called for will be accepted.

HEMCRAFTS

-All entries must be the work of one person with exception of quilt group.

SEWING

-Exhibits must be clean, new material to be used except in remodeling class

-Entries must not have won a previous prize at Carman Fair.

-All entries must have been made by the exhibitor within the last two years or will be disqualified.

SENIOR

-Quilting may be done by a group when specified.

-All rules for other sections apply to Senior Classes also.

BAKING

-Cakes must be removed from their containers.

-Pies must be a minimum of 6 inches in diameter.

-Baking must be enclosed in clear plastic bags

-Entries must be exhibitor's own work.

CANNING

- Jars must be labeled with contents

-All entries must be made in proper preserving jars. All recycled jars will be disqualified.

-Attach entry tags with rubber bands

-Jars will be opened by Judges for judging.

-Jam and jelly will not be accepted if covered with paraffin wax.

PLANTS AND FLOWERS

-Rules of judging are in "Horticultural Judging Standards", is available for your perusal in the Fair Office.

-Due to moisture conditions, tags must be closed with pins rather than scotch tape.

FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

-Exhibits must have been grown in 2009 by the exhibitor.

-Arrange vegetables on trays or firm plates and attach tag securely.

-One entry per household in all classes

-Rules for judging are in the book "Horticultural Judging Standards".
