

CARMAN COUNTRY FAIR 2009 LIVESTOCK PRIZE BOOK

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

ENTRY INFORMATION & ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE TIMES:



1. Due to our efforts to keep our show running smoothly, absolutely no new entries will be accepted after the DEADLINE as outlined in each section. Please register at the office before unloading on the grounds.
2. In order that exhibitors may avoid unnecessary delays, advanced entry forms should be completed and forwarded to the secretary-manager prior to arrival, together with appropriate entry fee where required. Entry forms may be phoned to 204-745-2226 or faxed to 204-745-6514, or emailed to carmfair@mts.net. Exhibitors are responsible for calling to ensure their FAX was transmitted.
3. All animals entered will be assigned a stall. Stall fees are to be remitted with entry. A stall cleaning deposit is required on a separate cheque at the time of entry. If stalls are cleaned, cheque will be returned or destroyed.
4. All 4H livestock entered into classes from the livestock book are required to pay entry/stall fees as indicated in each section of this prize book.
5. Exhibitors are reminded to bring their own hay and straw.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

1. **All animals must be submitted to veterinary examination if required. No animals having a contagious disease shall be allowed to occupy a stall or building on the exhibition grounds. If any animal through an oversight is admitted, the committee shall immediately order its removal from the grounds.**
2. **Prizes shall be awarded only to animals that are sound and free from disease except in the case of breeding stock injured by accident, which does not lessen their usefulness.**

RULES & REGULATIONS

Rules and regulations will be subject to any changes recommended by Agriculture Canada in the current year policy.

1. Exhibitors must have control of the animals at all times when on the property of the Dufferin Agricultural Society Inc. Bulls must have rings in their noses. All cattle must be properly secured with both a neck strap and halter to prevent the possibility of an accident. All stallions must be securely tied with both a halter and a neck strap. All livestock is the responsibility of the owner.
2. All exhibitors shall be neatly dressed when exhibiting livestock.
3. All exhibitors should at all times cooperate with the DAS Directors in the parking of trucks, trailers, etc.
4. Barns are to be cleaned by 8:00 a.m. and manure to be taken to the south end of the barns
5. Not more than two entries in any livestock class will be accepted from each exhibitor.
6. In the absence of competition in any section or if there are not at least three exhibitors in each breed or grouping of breeds in each of the beef classifications, or if the stock or article exhibited is of an inferior

quality, the judges are instructed to award only such premiums as in their opinions are warranted. They will exercise their discretion as to whether they award first, second, third, or any other prize.

7. No person shall be allowed to interfere with the judge while in the discharge of his/her duties. Exhibitors so interfering will forfeit the right to any premium to which they might otherwise be entitled.

8. No person shall be permitted in the livestock show rings during the time of the judging, except the judges or assistants, person in charge of the animals, Directors of the association and the press.

9. Directors are forbidden to wear Directors ribbons when showing animals in the show ring.

10. The pedigree of certificate of all purebred horses or cattle to be produced to the judges or directors if required. Breeding capability - in cases where doubt exists in the mind of the judge or officials as to the breeding capability of an animal, the exhibitor may be required to furnish evidence to the satisfaction of the official concerned.

11. The Directors will take every precaution under the circumstances to ensure the safety of exhibitor's property, and should property be accidentally damaged, lost or stolen, they will give all assistance in their power toward recovery of same but will not accept financial responsibility.

12. A meeting of the Directors will be held, notice of which will be given, to hear and decide any complaints or grievances that may have arisen in awarding of prizes. Protests must be made in writing to the Secretary-manager within ten days after the close of the exhibition.

13. Any infringement of the Rules and Regulations will result in withholding the prizes.

14. The first prize ribbon shall be red, the second prize blue, the third prize white, the fourth prize yellow and the fifth prize green.

15. A program for the judging of horses and cattle will be posted during the fair but exhibitors must ascertain from the directors in charge of the several departments, at what hour livestock will be judged. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to keep posted on the progress of the classes and to listen for any changes announced from the ringside.

16. Prizes given by the Society will be paid for by cheque made to the exhibitor/owner **as indicated on the entry form and mailed as soon as possible after the show.**

17. Soliciting for any purpose will not be permitted on the exhibition grounds, except from within a space allotted for that purpose, otherwise by special permission.

18. The DAS will not be responsible for goods left after the 6 pm on the last day of the Fair, when barns are to be cleaned and vacated.

19. Stock must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor or his authorized agent.

20. Only animals officially entered will be provided with barn accommodations. Accommodations will be allotted as entries are received.

21. Tampering with livestock - unnatural practices in fitting will not be tolerated, and all livestock entered for competition shall be presented in judging rings in their natural conformation and natural physical condition.

SPECIAL NOTE TO ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:

DUE TO THE HIGH VOLUME OF TRAFFIC EXPECTED DURING THE FAIR, THE SOUTH GATE OF THE GROUNDS WILL BE CLOSED TO ALL VEHICLES. EXHIBITORS ARE ASKED TO ENTER THE GROUNDS THROUGH THE NORTH GATE. ONCE YOU HAVE UNLOADED YOUR LIVESTOCK AND EQUIPMENT, PLEASE PARK YOUR VEHICLES ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE GROUNDS.

EARLY ENTRIES WOULD BE APPRECIATED. If exhibitors find they must cancel an entry or entries, there will be no penalty if DAS Secretary/Manager is notified of cancellation before judging begins. PLEASE MAKE YOUR ENTRIES EARLY!!

SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS:

1. All entries must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor.
2. All animals entered for exhibition must be in their place by 9 pm the evening before the show.
3. Entries **must** be in by 12:00 noon, Thurs. July 9, **ADVANCE ENTRIES WOULD BE APPRECIATED.**
Every animal entered will be assigned a stall fee of \$5.00 per stall.
4. **Exhibitor passes \$6. Wristband passes must be worn at all times on the fairgrounds.**

Definition of an Entry of Cattle

Breeding Classes:

For the purpose of classifications, an entry shall be interpreted as follows:

- All purebred registered animals, whether owned by one person or by more than one person (individually or jointly), which are maintained on one farm or breeding unit, are considered to be the production of one farm or breeding unit.
- In each classification where the same or common interests are involved in more than one breeding operation, such operations are considered one breeding unit.
- Only one entry per class is eligible from such farm or breeding unit, except this Fair will authorize two entries per class in a maximum of three classes; exclusive of the steer class.
- **EACH BREED MUST HAVE AT LEAST THREE EXHIBITORS**
- **ALL ENTRIES MUST BE OWNED BY AND REGISTERED IN THE NAME OF THE EXHIBITOR.**
- All Exhibits must be weighed at the show prior to showing, with the birth date, show weight and weight per day of age for all calves and yearlings to be exhibited in individual classes to be posted in the stall.

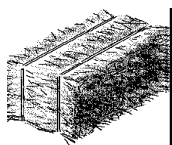

Class 9. Female born prior to January 1, 2007

Note - For Class 9 - with her own 2009 natural calf to be shown as a unit, except that the calf is eligible to be shown as a single animal in group class or calf classes.

Class 10. Breeders Herd

Note - Breeders herd - a group of 4 animals, both sexes represented, must have been shown in previous classes. At least one animal must be owned by the exhibitor. Limit to one exhibit per exhibitor.

Entry Fee: \$3 per class except for stake classes, which are \$10 per entry. ENTRY NOT REFUNDABLE WITHOUT A VALID VETERINARY CERTIFICATE.

Exhibitor Wristbands - \$6 must be worn at all times while on the grounds. Must be shown at time entries are made.

Stall Fee: All entries will be assigned a stall fee. \$5 per tie stall, \$5 per tack stall and \$10 per box stall to be remitted with entry. \$20 cleaning deposit is to be remitted at the same time on a separate cheque. If stalls are cleaned, cheque will be returned or destroyed. **Tying to trailers is not permitted.** Stalls are available on a first come first serve basis; stalls may be selected when entries are made. All paid entries must reach the Fair office by Thursday, July 9 at 12 noon. Paid entries not received by the deadline will be charged a late fee of double the entry fee. Advance entries would be appreciated and may be made by phoning 204-745-2226 during office hours; by faxing 204-745-6514 at any time; or by email to carmfair@mts.net. If entries are faxed, exhibitors may ensure their entry faxed correctly by phoning the office during office hours. No entries will be taken at ringside.

Exhibitor wristbands are \$6 and must be worn at all times on the grounds.

Rules & Regulations

1. Entries must enter ring promptly when class is called, or judging will proceed without entry.
2. All stallions must be securely tied with both a halter and a neck strap and are the responsibility of the owner.
3. Barns are to be cleaned by 8 a.m. manure taken to the south end of the barn. **DO NOT** put straw, hay or manure in the refuse barrels—the barrels are for discarded plastic and paper only. Violators will be fined.
4. Age of exhibitors computed as of Jan 1 of the current year.
5. Animals will be measured, if necessary, by an official of the Fair Board, if there is any doubt as to the height of an animal entered in a restricted division or class.
6. Protests must be made in writing and signed. In case of protest, the committee rules with CEF.
7. Dufferin Ag Society encourages the use of helmets for safety purposes.

- Section “A” shall not exceed 12.2 hands. Whiskers may be trimmed, mane may be thinned or a narrow plait behind ear is acceptable.
- Section “B” shall not exceed 14 hands. Mane & tail may be thinned, pulled, or braided. Feathers are removed from heels and excess hair removed from around ears, muzzle and jaw line.
- Section “C” and “D” cobs are shown with full mane and tail and feather on their heels.
- Handlers to enter the ring clockwise on the rail. To be judged 75% on breed type, confirmation, quality and substance and 25% of way of going. The judge shall conduct the class so that each animal is viewed in action and in profile as well as front and rear.
